Till Your Dying Days, This Sin Cannot be Atoned for! Isaiah 22:1-14

I. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND AND BIBLICAL CONTEXT A. Historical Background

The history of the Israelites is filled with **spiritual corruption** stemming from unfaithfulness and disobedience due to their recurring affinity to **idol worship**. Because of their unfaithfulness to God and disregard or willful negligence of their obligations to **the Covenant**, their history is punctuated by periods of turmoil, conflicts, wars, defeats and destructions! The Bible highlights that most of the kings after King David gravitated toward idolatry of all kinds thereby leading the Israelites astray. Furthermore, Scripture points to the fact that when trouble comes due to their unfaithfulness, the Kings of Judah and Israel sought the help of **idol worshipping Kings** instead of repenting and seeking God's forgiveness thereby adding to their wickedness!

B. Biblical Context

In Isaiah chapter 22, there is reference to "**The Valley of Vision**" which we need to understand to get at **the revelations** in the 14 verses we are examining today. Obviously, "**The Valley of Vision**" is in connection to **Jerusalem** and we need to understand *why it is eternally significant*. My biblical research led me to examine "**Valley**" and "**Vision**" in the *context of the Prophecy of Isaiah* regarding **Jerusalem**.

- 1. <u>Valley</u>. Jerusalem City was established among two prominent valleys The **Kidron Valley** and the **Hinnom Valley**. "Jerusalem was built on two triangle-shaped <u>ridges</u> which converge to the south. On the east lay the <u>ravine</u> known as the '**Kidron Valley**.' On the west lay the <u>deep gorge</u> known as the '**Hinnom Valley**.' At southern border of the city, the two valleys converged. Only on the northern border was the city <u>vulnerable</u> to <u>attack</u>. The lack of water supply was solved by using a natural spring that flowed from the '**Kidron Valley**."
 - a) Characteristics of Valleys.
 Valleys represents low areas of land surrounded by elevated landforms such as mountains, hills, or plateaus. The different types include V-shaped (river), U-shaped (glacier), rift, and flat-floored valleys.
 - b) Characteristics of Ridges.

A ridge is a long, narrow, elevated geomorphologic landform, structural feature, or a combination of both separated from the surrounding terrain by steep sides. The sides of a ridge slope away from a narrow top, the crest or Ridgecrest, with the terrain dropping down on either side.

- 2. <u>Vision</u>. Vision is given to the Servants (for example, Joseph, David, Daniel, Peter, John) and Prophets of God (Isaiah, Ezekiel, Jeremiah, etc.). <u>Visions</u> given in Prophecies can be "visions of judgement" whereby God speaks of the way He is going to judge/punish kings, people, nations, for example. Visions given in Prophecies are also "visions of Hope, Redemption, Restorations and Victory." As we studied the Book of Isaiah, we see how God gave Isaiah the Prophecies against many nations mentioned by name. Within the Prophecies, God gave the "vision" as to how/when His Judgement will be manifested, carried out, thereby <u>the vision becoming the realities</u> of the particular people or specific nations.
- 3. Valley of Vision. When we combine the two words Valley and Vision in connection with **Jerusalem**, the Prophecies in Isaiah 22 become clearer. The spiritual and literal significance of **Jerusalem** must be understood in the context of God's Plan of Salvation as manifested in Canaan during the time of Joshua (the fulfillment of **God's Vision** for Israel as promised to Abraham and Sarah) and reinstituted by King David who recovered the lost territories during the Time of Judges. The Ultimate Spiritual Significance of Jerusalem for God's chosen people (Israel) was fulfilled through David who established the City and laid the foundation for the Jerusalem Temple. God's Glorious Plan of **Salvation** for the world was supposed to *emanate* from **Jerusalem** and *spread* out to all nations! The Israelites were supposed to be "holy and blameless" examples to other nations who were idol worshippers! Instead, on many occasions, Jerusalem became the center of abomination due to their unfaithfulness and disobedience to God by engaging in idolatry! Hence, God judged Judah/Jerusalem by sending idol worshipping nations such as the Assyrians and Babylonians to punish them! Jerusalem became the focus of many Prophecies embedded with **Visions**. Hence, the reference to Jerusalem as "The Valley of Visions." Jerusalem is the recipient of both Prophecies of Judgement (Condemnation/Destructions/Defeat) and Prophecies of Hope (Redemption/Restoration/Victory). Thank God for the faithfulness of Abrahan and Sarah, Moses, Joshua and Samuel! Praise God for Judge Deborah, Queen Esther and Ruth! Thank God for the faithfulness and obedience of David! Thank God for blessing the lineage of King David! Praise God for blessing David who served Him wholeheartedly, faithfully and obediently! Thank God for God's Promises to David in 2 Samuel 7:1-29! Thank God for the Prophecies in Isaiah 9:1-7 and 11:1-16!!! Hallelujah! Thank God for Apostle Paul, Barnabas, Prisilla & Aquila! Praise God for Matthew 28:18-20 and Acts 1:1-11! Jesus is our Redeemer who reigns from Heaven!

II. THE LESSON: This Sin Cannot be Atoned for!1. vv. 1-4. Jerusalem - City of Tumult, Revelry and Lament!

In the Vision, Isaiah saw a troubled city "full of commotion, tumult and **revelry**." Understand that Isaiah saw what God intended for him to see as in the Vision. Have you ever considered what God sees of us looking down from heaven? We know God sees, hears and knows all things! What God saw and heard in Jerusalem was a city which was filled with "commotion, tumult and revelry." Instead of a city in which God's Glory, Power and Grace were magnified, idolatry had taken root and spread! Instead of God's Love, Justice and Mercy being magnified, Jerusalem was filled with hatefulness, injustices and merciless deeds! The leaders (kings, royal officials, priests, judges and the elders) were *corrupt* due to their eager devotion, participation and promotion of idol worships of all kinds! Consequently, the whole city became **tumultuous** erupting in "commotion or violent agitations of the multitude accompanied with great uproar and confused voices." Jerusalem became a city where **revelry** characterized by eating and drinking frenzies such as when a violent mob celebrate after their killing, raping, looting and burning raids against defenseless children, men and women! Isaiah, horrified by the horrible Vision of Jerusalem burst with a lament saying, "Turn away from me; let me weep bitterly. Do not try to console me over the destruction of my people!" Jerusalem, "Valley of Vision," a city of such atrocities!

2. vv. 5-8. God Striped Away the Defenses of Judah

God *showed* Isaiah what will happen to Judah/Jerusalem when He *removes* **His Protection**. The Bible says,

- a) in verse 5, "The LORD, the LORD Almighty, has a day of tumult and trampling and terror in the 'Valley of Vision,' a day of battering down walls and of crying out to the mountains." We must pay attention to the emphasis in the way God is addressed in verse 5: "The LORD, the LORD Almighty." The Titles say it all! "The LORD" denotes God's Sovereignty, the One who reigns from heaven! He is LORD over His Creation! "The LORD Almighty" emphasizes the indescribable **Power** of God. His **Might** as the LORD of the Universe! The Might that Created the Universe! Almighty means "unlimited in Power, Ability and Authority." As such, God is **Omnipotent!** The two Titles, "The LORD" and "The LORD Almighty" joined together gives us a picture and understanding of the limitless Power, Ability and Authority of God which is hard for us to grasp fully in our very limited capacity to comprehend! But such expressions give us a glimpse of God's Awesome Power, Ability and Authority over His Creation! Isaiah says, "The LORD, The LORD Almighty" has appointed a **Day of Reconning** for the "Valley of Vision." The Almighty God has decreed a day of
 - "tumult and trampling and terror" indicating how terrifying that day will be to the *inhabitants* of Judah/Jerusalem. On that Day, terrified

Almighty will unleash! On that Day, people will flee from the Royal Palace, fenced luxurious homes and buildings of business because they become death-traps instead of secure places! In the process of fleeing them, terrified people will run into each other trampling many to death! It will be a day of tumult! Total chaos!

- "battering down walls and of crying out to the mountains" indicating that invaders will "batter down" the city "walls." The Israelites will have no place to escape except running desperately to the mountains!
- b) in verses 6 & 7, the Bible mentions "Elam" and "Kir." Elam was the ancestor of the Elamites (Ezra 10:22). In the time of Abrham, Elam was described as "the overlord of three Mesopotamian kings (Genesis 14:1-17). In Isaiah Elam is mentioned as a people who "takes up the quiver, with her charioteers and horses," fierce warriors whom God uses to punish the Israelites! "Kir" has its origin in Moab. In verses 6 and 7, Isaiah describes them as warriors armed with "shields, chariots and horsemen" whom The LORD Almighty unleashed terror on the "Valley of Vision." The Bible is full of revelations as to God's Sovereignty over kings, nations and people. God has used many nations and people such as Elam and Kir as His instruments to punish the Israelites throughout their history! Notic also that Elam and Kir were not the largest nations or armies (as compared to when God sent the Assyrians or the Babylonians). Yet, the Israelites were totally defenseless and in disarray against such smaller forces!
- c) **in verse 8,** God removes His protection. Notice that **Elam** and **Kir** were able to invade and bring horrific chaos upon Jerusalem only because "the defense of Judah were *stripped away*" by God. On that Day, **God removed His Protection over Judah!**

3. vv. 9-11. They Looked for Things Instead of God for their Defense

In these verses, the Bible indicates what the Israelites tried to do to defend themselves from Elam and Kir. The Israelites:

- "looked for weapons in the Palace of the Forest;
- "saw the City of David had many breaches in its defense;
- "stored up water in the Lower Pool;
- "counted the buildings in Jerusalem;
- "tore down houses to strengthen the wall;
- "built a reservoir between the two walls for the water of the Old Pool."
 All of the above neither could protect them nor save them from God's
 Judgement! <u>The indictment</u> is found in verse 11 where it is written "but you did not look to the One who made it or have regard for the One who

planned it long ago." They looked for **Things** were **utterly useless** and did **Things** which were utterly futile **activities** since they did not include God! The Israelites valued **Things** rather than the Almighty God who created everything! The Israelites put their faith in **Things** and their own efforts rather than **The LORD**, **The LORD** Almighty!

4. vv. 12-14. This Sin Cannot be Atoned for!

a) Verse 12. God called Judah to Repentance but got Revelry Instead!

In the Old Testament, when the people wanted to demonstrate *repentance* and *remorse*, the tradition was "to take off their regular, official, royal, and priestly clothes and wear sackcloth. Or, they tore their cloth, put on sack-clothe and covered themselves with dust." Such **humility**, show of **remors**e and expression of **genuine repentance** in the face of Prophetic Judgement is often accompanied by a period of fasting and prayer! In verse 12, Isaiah says, "**The LORD**, **the LORD Almighty**, *called you* on that day to weep and to wail, to tear out your hair and put on sackcloth." But, Judah's reaction was the exact opposite!

b) Verse 13. Israel's Response "Let us Eat, Drink and be Merry!"

What Isaiah saw in the "Valley of Vision" was the Israelites throwing big parties in *total disregard* to God's Call for Repentance! God was giving them the opportunity to repent even at the last minute! Under the Banner of "Let Us Eat, Drink and be Merry," They were engaged in **revelry** as in "being festive in a **riotous manner**; a merrymaking, carousing, noisy celebration!" There was a lot of eating, drinking and carefree ruckus going on!

c) Verse 14. God's Final Judgement: This Sin Cannot be Atoned for!

Isaiah heard "**The LORD Almighty**" say to him "**This Sin Cannot be Atoned for!**" The Loving, Gracious and Merciful God had enough of their unforgivable *insolence*, total disregard for His Sovereignty and **willful disobedience**! It is one thing when people who do not know God behave as they did in verse 13. It is absolutely a different matter when God's chosen people treat **The LORD**, **The LORD Almighty** as the people of Judah did!

III. CONCLUSION/APPLICATION.

Read Hebrews 10:19-33. In verse 31, the Bible says, "It is a dreadful thing to fall into the hands of the Living God!"
